

## How to Choose which Font Package to Install

IDAutomation provides two separate installations within this font package. Install the version that best meets your needs. If in doubt, use the standard installation. All symbol encoded fonts in this package contain the word “Symbol” or “Sym” in the font name.

Advantages	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Provides the highest level of compatibility with all applications and embedding utilities.</li> <li>Provides the highest level of compatibility with cross-platform use.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The symbol encoding within the font will usually show the font in its own name, making it easier for users to select the desired font within an application, as shown below.</li> </ul>
Disadvantages	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Standard fonts usually show the font in its own name with a preview, which can make it difficult to select the desired barcode font within some applications, as shown below. This is because characters representing the name are actually barcode symbols within the font.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Symbol encoded fonts may not be compatible with (1) systems not using the US Western Latin-1 character set, (2) all applications and (3) cross-platform use.</li> <li>Symbol fonts are usually only available in TTF form and do not include sizes larger than “L”.</li> </ul>
